1st YEAR of WIPAN FUNDING for PILOT PROGRAM COMPLETED!

WIPAN would like to extend our sincere gratitude to the [NSW Office for Women's Policy](#) for their generous funding of our pilot project over the past year (2009-10). This has been a very exciting time for us as an organisation, establishing ourselves in the not for profit community sector. During this time we were able to employ our Programs Coordinator, develop the policy, procedural and administrative components of the organisation, establish a supportive network amongst various other community organisations, develop a strong working relationship with various government departments, begin our mentoring program and increase our memberships. Most importantly though, we have had the opportunity to meet with numerous women caught up in the criminal justice system, to listen and learn from their lived experience.

STRATEGIC PLANNING for 2011

The WIPAN Executive Committee, staff and members recently held a special meeting to discuss and develop our strategic plan for the coming 12 months. Outcomes from the meeting; WIPAN will endeavour to have a strong focus on the expansion of our mentoring program; engage in systemic advocacy and policy reform and aim to highlight issues relating to the victimisation of women prisoners. All of us at WIPAN feel incredibly fortunate to have had the opportunity to support many women prisoners/ex-prisoners throughout 2009-2010 and are extremely excited in our commitment to support many more in the coming year.

SERVICE OF THE MONTH: CRC Targeted Housing and Support Service - THaSS

The [Community Restorative Centre](#) (CRC) has initiated their THaSS project - **Targeted Housing and Support Service** - in Western Sydney. The Targeted Housing Support Project is a partnership between [Corrective Services NSW](#) (CSNSW), [Housing NSW](#), [Department of Health, Community Services, Aging, Disability and Home Care](#), with Corrective Services NSW as the lead agency.

THaSS is being piloted for the first three years to work with female ex-prisoners. The objective of the project is to achieve a reduction in the rates of homelessness and a reduction in rates of re-offending. THaSS workers will assist clients to integrate back into the community by organising stable, comfortable and secure housing with sustained support services that specifically address their social and criminogenic needs.

The project will focus on female ex-prisoners on release who have children and/or complex needs such as intellectual disabilities, low cognitive functioning, substance abuse and/or mental health issues. The target group will be restricted to sentenced prisoners just prior to and after release. A major goal is to prevent exits into rough sleeping or transient, unsuitable accommodation. THaSS currently have 50% of their referrals for Indigenous women but this may vary over time.
